Arriving from non-EU countries

On arrival in the Solent, some yachts may require pilotage. If they intend entering Portsmouth Harbour, see www.qhmportsmouth.com (notice to Mariners no. LNTM 11/11). www.southamptonvts.com is the website to visit to ensure you comply with Southampton port bylaws in sailing in their waters.

If you are arriving into the UK directly from a country outside the EU (which includes arriving from the Channel Islands) you must fly the Q flag from the 12 nautical mile (territorial waters) limit and report to customs by telephoning the National Yachtline on 0845 723 1110. Notice 8 details the requirements for the completion of form C1331 and the address to which the form must be sent can be found on the form.
